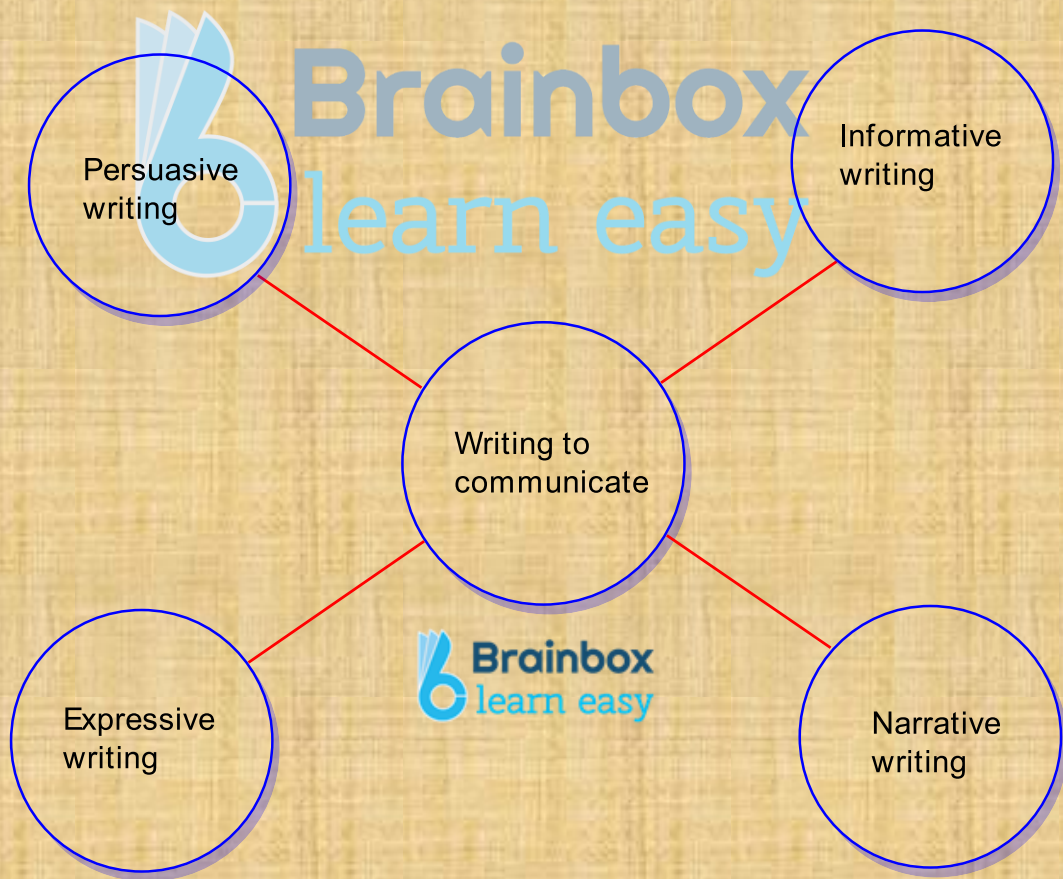


CHAPTER 01

- Following are the four methods of writing to describe what they are learning.



Informative writings:

- Describes your observation, inferences and conclusion.
- Explains how to perform an experiment.

Describes something, give examples (or) tell a story.

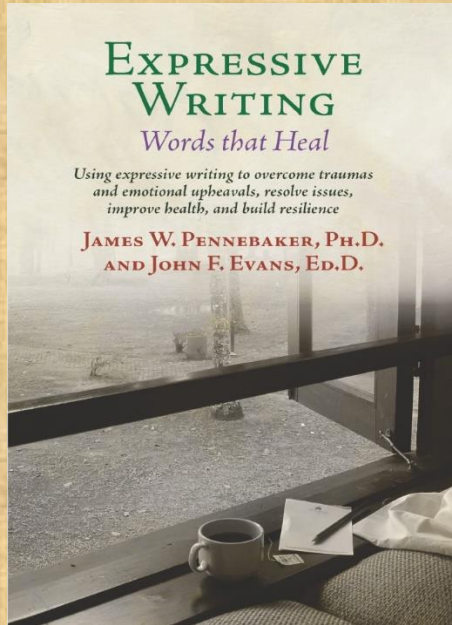
Narrative Writing
